COVID-19 Reopening Plan Guidelines

ALL PHASES MUST FOLLOW CDC GUIDELINES: PHYSICAL DISTANCING, FACE MASKS, AND HAND SANITIZER AT ENTRY POINTS. Continue to shelter in place if you are high risk (65 and older, underlying health condition). Stay at home if you are sick, until at least 10 days past initial symptoms, AND 3 days fever-free (without medicine), AND no respiratory symptoms. Recommendations for cleaning and sanitizing will be followed in all phases. For updates check out the St. Mark's website, stmarkscarmel.org/reopening. We are currently in Phase B.

What to Expect on Sundays When We Worship

- Masks are required.
- Every other pew will be used.
- Due to seating constraints, please wait to be seated by the ushers, and please stay in that seat. The Sanctuary will be filled from front to back. This allows for maximum seating capacity, minimizes cross-traffic, and complies with CDC Guidelines.
- Only family members may sit next to each other. All other people need to be at least 6 ft apart.
- Music will be provided by music team; however, there is no congregational singing.
- When Sanctuary reaches capacity (70-75 people) no one else will be seated.
- Sanctuary will be cleaned in between services.
- After the postlude is complete, ushers will dismiss from the back to front of the church to reduce cross-traffic and allow for minimal contact.
- Bathrooms will be available for emergency use.
- Hand Sanitizer Stations are available.
- Please leave the church as soon as you are released from Sanctuary.
- No Sunday school classes, Kidz Church, or nursery care will be provided.

Dear Co-workers in Christ,

It is August. I'll confess that August is in many ways one of my least favorite months. In church life, activities often come to a standstill. Many church members are taking last-minute vacations. Families are preparing for returning to school and shopping for supplies. We catch our breath before the many study groups, committee meetings, and mission activities begin for the fall. In the midst of the pause I always have some nagging anxiety that people might not show up again as we begin our active church life in September. Moving into the school year is an act of faith with a little trepidation.



It is obvious to everyone that this year is different. We won't be moving into September in the same way that we do most years, but we are still courageously moving forward into a new reality for our world, our country, and our church. Many of our activities will continue to happen electronically – committee meetings, study groups, and worship. We are working hard planning ways to meet safely while including people who need to continue sheltering at home for the foreseeable future. We are learning new things every day and will continue to prayerfully use all the means we have to be the church despite the obstacles before us.

Our commitment to helping people connect to the world in service and mission projects has not changed. SEPTEMBER IS NATIONAL HUNGER ACTION MONTH!

Did you know:

- 70 million people in the US today are hungry or food insecure (since COVID-19).
- We will throw away over 133 billion pounds of food in 2020.
- Society of St Andrews (SOSA) shares healthy, nourishing food with hungry people in the USA by sending volunteers to glean (pick, dig or gather) fresh fruit and vegetables from fields and orchards.
- SOSA focuses on preventing food waste through many projects (including Potato & Produce Project, Harvest of Hope and the Gleaning Network.
- In 2019 29,000 volunteers worked with SOSA to put more than 69 million servings of food on tables. (Working with faith groups, secular groups, schools and individuals)
- In 2020 through July
 - SOSA has gleaned, gathered and distributed 12,501,707 pounds of fresh product in 2,803 events with 9,866 volunteers.
 - Food donated by 528 farmers has been distributed to hungry people through 1,497 feeding agencies.
 - Pounds of food already wasted in the US this year: 80,230,619,0143 and counting. (This waste happens in fields, transportation, supermarkets, restaurants and homes.)

- · Organize interventions and activate mission teams to address the specific injustices.



On August 26 we celebrated Women's Equality Day and 100 years since the 19th Amendment to the Constitution was passed, giving women the right to vote. This year also marks the 55th Anniversary of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, which prohibited racial discrimination in voting in the United States. Furthermore, we had several strong months in the fall of 2019 so we remain cautiously optimistic. Uncertainty still looms, as we all know, but I am still encouraged by your continued support. Your finance committee continues to evaluate alternatives, but we have yet to be faced with any difficult decisions. Thank Goodness! We continue to pray for our church, our staff, our congregation, our nation, our teachers, and everyone facing uncertainty. Thank you for your continued support.


