SOCIAL ACTION

I CAN'T HEAR YOU!

Three members of St. Marks recently told me that they can't hear in numerous church settings. One member thought that he might quit going to a class because he not only could not understand the leader, but also had difficulty understanding other members of the class.

The inability to hear properly leads to social isolation, anger and sadness, but it is very common. Technologies grouped under a category called "assistive listening" may help. These technologies are used with amplified sound such as that provided by a microphone with speakers. They work together with hearing aid compatible receivers. "A receiver is hearing aid compatible when it works with a telecoil installed in a hearing aid or cochlear implant." So these technologies will be available only when the user has a hearing aid or cochlear implant that has a telecoil. One estimate states that 70% of hearing aids and cochlear implants have these telecoils.



What can you do? If you or someone close to you who attends St. Marks has significant hearing impairment, please contact Justin Vance and let him know if you would be willing to wear something around your neck or would rather have a system installed that automatically works with the hearing aid? Justin would appreciate any of your comments regarding assisted listening technologies.

You are welcome to attend and learn more about the program even if you have not read a book.


