Dear Co-workers in Christ,

Over the past two years we have adapted to perpetual changes in the health environment by going virtual in worship, beginning in-person worship again, then shutting down in the building activities a second time, and finally continuing a progressive reentry to the building. We have been living the cliché, two steps forward – one step backward. I remember talking to people in the spring of this year saying that surely we would mostly be back to normal in August only to have the Delta variant make that prediction inaccurate.



With vaccinations finally available for some of our children and some anticipation for vaccines being available for all ages there really is cause to be optimistic about our ability to return to normal activities in our church building. We are beginning to have recreational activities in Wesley Hall once more. Holy Walk will return this year. We will have our normal worship schedule for Christmas Eve.

There are many reasons to be hopeful as we enter into this Advent & Christmas season and as we enter 2022.

Having said that there are still challenges for us as we move into the future. We are making every effort to reconnect and reinvite people to the activities that they were a part of pre-COVID. We are trying to take the things that we have learned during the pandemic and retain the new practices that make sense to continue into the future. We will have financial challenges as we adjust to changes in attendance and giving patterns in our congregation. Eventually, the United Methodist Church will be able to convene a general conference and make decisions about our denomination and human sexuality.

In the midst of all these decision points, our commitment to welcoming people into a relationship with Jesus Christ and the church is strong. We continue to find ways to grow in our relationship with God and with one another. We continue to be a congregation that strives to make mission a way of life and not just a Sunday morning experience. Our methods may change but our core values have remained strong and have carried us through many difficult time during this season and I believe these values will continue to carry us into God's future.

Most importantly, God has continued to be a sure and present help in the midst of these troubled times. People have often heard me say, "Whatever happens, God will still be God."

Pandemics will come and go. Denominational decisions will eventually happen. The presence and power of God will remain.

Jesus said to the disciples, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:19-20, NRSV)

Dear St. Mark's,

Are we there yet?

I remember being the one to say those words as a child, but I also remember the exhaustion of being the recipient of those words. It's such a simple question, but when we stop and analyze it there's always more to find. Sometimes we ask if we're at our destination because we're bored and want to move onto the next thing. Sometimes we ask if we're there yet because we want to know how much time is left to complete whatever else we have going on during the journey. And sometimes



we ask because we're in an unfamiliar place and we're scared. Nothing is what it's supposed to be, and we want to know if we'll ever reach the point where things make sense.

At the current this Advent season we're asking the question, "Are we there yet?" with a response of, "Do you have everything that you need?" Because a journey becomes even harder when we don't have everything that we need for the trip. And we can only have everything that we need when we realize where it is that we're wanting to go. For Christians, the ultimate goal of our journey is to be with God. To be in God's presence fully and completely. Advent is a season of preparation for not only the birth of Christ, but also for the time when we can be fully with God. And in the journey to draw closer to God the things that are needed most are peace, hope, joy, and love. For this current part of our journey, most of us weren't fully prepared. We didn't have an overflowing wellspring of peace, hope, joy, and love to draw from when the pandemic started and it's been hard to replenish those stores when everything continues to be topsy turvy. But the nice thing about any journey is that even when you're on the road, there are still places where you can stop and pick up the things you need. So this Advent season, take a break. Take a moment to stop and breathe. Find the things that give you peace and joy. Look for signs of hope and give and receive love wholeheartedly. Take a break in the journey so that you have the strength to make it the rest of the way.

We're not there yet, and that's okay.

On the Advent of a New Adventure

This is the waiting season. We wait for the celebration of Jesus' birth. But we want more than a party. We want the peace and promise of new life that Jesus' birth brings. I am reminded of the words in Luke 1:45, "Blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to her." She believed in spite of the outrageous words she heard.

Hope often starts small. We have a glimpse of what might be even though we see what is happening in the world around us. This small hope is nurtured as we remember what God has done in the past. In advent we are called, like Mary, to trust that we can follow God's radical leading to join with others who can see the world as God sees it.



As I move into retirement in January I am waiting. I'm making lists of things I need and want to do. Each page of lists has lots of white space because I want to have room for the new ways God is calling me. My vocation has not changed. The ways of fulfilling my vocation have and will change.

Every time I have moved to a new appointment I have felt that I have left things unfinished. The work has always been bigger than can be accomplished. In his book, Life Work, Donald Hall recounts a conversation with Henry Moore. Hall had asked Moore about the secret of life. Moore responded: "The secret of life is to have a task, something you devote your life to, something you bring everything to, every minute of the day for your whole life. And the most important thing is ---it must be something you cannot possibly do!" I railed against this when I first read it. I didn't want to be doing something for my whole life and find that it was impossible. But the older I have gotten the more I understand.

We move into Advent every year knowing that the world is not as it should be. Children go to bed hungry. Wars rage around the world. Poverty is a reality for more and more people. Our work as Christians is not finished. We continue to prepare for the birth of Christ with the expectation that there is hope; even if the hope is as small as a mustard seed. We hope.

My prayer for you is that you will live in hope.

- Red Bird Mission, guided by Jesus Christ, empowers individuals and advocates justice by providing spiritual, educational, health, and community outreach ministries in southeastern Kentucky.
- The need is great in this isolated, rural area where chronic poverty, lack of jobs, poor housing and rugged terrain create obstacles to a fuller life. Red Bird Mission strives to meet the needs of their neighbors through ministry in five areas: Education, Health & Wellness, Community Outreach, Economic Opportunity, and Community Housing Improvement.
- The students, staff and families of Red Bird Christian School are meeting the challenges presented by the pandemic, laboring through hardships to complete academic requirements. Grants and gifts have been helping provide the technology to deliver online instruction and get equipment and access to each home. Delays in delivery of computer hardware have been a challenge but the students are progressing.

Did You Know?

- Mission Guatemala is a United Methodist related organization with a mission to help meet the basic needs and improve the quality of life of under-served Guatemalan people through health, education, and nutrition initiatives and meaningful missionary service.
- Guatemala has one of the highest rates in the world for chronic childhood malnutrition.
 In rural areas, the often underserved and under-resourced indigenous Mayan communities can experience chronic childhood malnutrition reaching as high as 70%.
- For over 11 years now, Mission Guatemala's nutritional initiatives have included full-time school nutrition programs, and weekly lunches served in a number of community public elementary schools.
- Additional projects continue: medical clinic and pharmacy, dental clinic, eye clinic, feeding centers for chronically malnourished children, community development projects, vocational training programs, water filters for schools and families, fuel efficient wood burning stoves.
- Because of the generous support from many partners, Mission Guatemala was able to purchase their clinic property in 2020, in San Andrés Semetabaj. For more information visit <u>missionguatemala.com</u>. Their philosophy is based on John Wesley's teaching to, "Do all the good you can."



Wheeler Mission

Wheeler Mission is a Christian, non-denominational social services organization, which provides critically needed goods and services to the homeless, poor, and needy of central Indiana, including shelter. Help is offered without regard to race, color, sexual orientation, creed national origin or religion. Through January St. Mark's is collecting personal items for



those served at Wheeler Mission (men, women, and children) who struggle with poverty, hunger and homelessness. The #1 most need items are 1-Day Bus Passes. Passes can be purchased at buy.indygo.net, for \$4 each. Passers can be shipped directly to Wheeler Mission-Bus Ticket Program, 205 E. New York St, Indianapolis, IN 46204, or delivered to St. Mark's UMC.

Other donation items needed (new or clean gently used): bath towels ($27" \times 54"$), twin fitted (deep pocket) sheets, twin fleece blanket, handwarmers, baby wipes (unscented hypoallergenic). Items may be dropped off at our donation bins inside door #2, between Monday-Friday, 9:00 AM- 4:00 PM.

Interfaith Hospitality Network Returns!

January 23-30, 2022

St. Mark's has been a long-time partner of Interfaith Hospitality Network, the hallmark program of Family Promise. IHN is a coordinated response of the faith community that provides emergency food & shelter, offers individual skill



development & rehabilitation, advocates for economic stability and strives to end homelessness for the guests they serve. Each congregation in the network takes turns furnishing overnight lodging and meals during their assigned week, a few times each year. Our role as volunteers is fundamental to this program - we can make a difference by offering dignified compassionate assistance to families who have lost their homes.

Family Promise requires their guests (who are age eligible) to be fully vaccinated, as well as volunteers that will be in direct contact with guest families.

How can I help?

- **Dinner hosts** (5:00 PM-8:00 PM) serve and share a prepared meal with our guests, provide companionship & fellowship, help with clean up after dinner
- Meal preparation Prepare part of a meal for 10-15 people and deliver it to St. Mark's
- Provide pantry food provide store-bought breakfast & lunch foods
- Overnight hosts (8:00 PM -7:00 AM) be part of a team that spends the night at St. Mark's and is on-hand to assist guests
- Set up, tear down and clean up help set up beds and rooms on January 23, and/or help remove beds and clean up on January 30
- Transportation drive the IHN van between St. Mark's and the IHN Day Center



We look forward to a new year and following God as God calls us into new areas of witness and mission. It is through everyone's generosity that the work of God through the church moves forward!

Finance

I wanted to take a moment to say thanks to everyone: I have served as your Finance Chair for the past two years and it has been an honor and privilege, and I appreciate the support I have received from the congregation and finance committee.

Thankfully, it has not been necessary for me to present to the congregation because, thanks to your generosity, we have been able to meet all of our obligations, in spite of the events over the past two years. This has taken a certain amount of creativity and we end 2021 and enter 2022 with some financial challenges before us.

You may have heard before that contributions through the summer always "slump," that is, we receive lower contributions in the summer and rely on higher contribution toward the end of the year to make our budget work. This year, donations for September and October were \$24,000 less than what we would have expected based on the last six years' trends.

I pray that we will play "catch up" in November, and December will close out as we have done in the past: on average, December's contributions represent nearly the equivalent of two month's donations – December is that important in the life of the church.

We have benefitted from help through a PPP grant, fewer expenses due to reduced church activities, and one-time gifts to help offset shortfalls in our tithes and offering in 2020 and 2021. While we are grateful for these revenue streams, we are committed to making sure ministries are supported within the giving commitments of people like you sitting in the pews and worshiping

at home. Your pledges and continued donations are critical to St. Mark's.

2022 will also be a challenge. We have begun our budgeting process and have developed several contingency plans. Undoubtedly, we will be making several significant cuts in the budget for 2022 but we will still need our members to continue to give, and also to consider increasing their giving, if we are to continue supporting the mission and ministry of the congregation, to which God is calling us. Many years ago, my mother directed me to Malachi who provided my assurance: "Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. "TEST ME ON THIS," says the Lord Almighty, "and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that there will not be room enough to store it." Mal 3:10



QPR is an evidence-based program teaching how to recognize and respond to warning signs, clues and communications of suicidal people and how to get help for the person who has suicidal thoughts. It is not a form of counseling, but rather a way to act vigorously to prevent a possible tragedy. Attendees will receive a QPR booklet, card of warning signs, methods to encourage a person to get help, and community resource lists. QPR training is recommended for adults of all ages, regardless of your life stage. Students in grade 9-12 are welcome to attend with an accompanying parent.
