Dear Co-workers in Christ,

Recently, I was asked by our Conference Superintendent, Rev. Dr. Saneta Maiko, to write briefly a response to the question "Why am I United Methodist?" for a district publication. I wanted to share those thoughts here as well.

In 1986 I began full-time ministry in Indiana which included a two-year probationary period before being eligible for final ordination as Elder. Prior to ordination there is a significant number of written responses to questions required and one that I remember was, "Why do you still say 'yes' to ministry?" I am going to approach these thoughts around the question, "Why do you still say 'yes' to the United Methodist Church?"



I say "yes" to the United Methodist Church because of its continued emphasis on making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. In his book, *Simply Good News*, N.T. Wright says, "instead of suggesting that we could escape the earth to go to heaven, Jesus's good news was about heaven coming to earth." (Wright, *Simply Good News*, 7) From its beginnings the United Methodist Church is about extending the invitation to live out the Lord's Prayer where we pray, "Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in Heaven." (Matthew 6:10)

I say "yes" to the United Methodist Church because of our open table approach to Holy Communion. We use the model of Jesus who was criticized for welcoming all people to his table. In Mark 2:16-17 the authorities of the day took issue with the way Jesus welcomed all people to dine with him. I'm grateful that in our church the table is open to all.

I say "yes" to the United Methodist Church because we allow for theological debate and growth. We have never been a denomination that required people to adhere to a specific creed or set of detailed beliefs. In the early church the basic affirmation of believers was "Jesus is Lord." Jesus himself answered the question of essential belief by replying, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength.' The second is this, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these." (Matthew 12:30-31) Jesus resisted attaching enumerated lists or requirements to these two commandments and the church has been at its best when it has followed Jesus' model, as does the United Methodist Church.

Finally, I say "yes" to the United Methodist Church because it is the church that has nurtured me in the faith, has recognized my call to ministry, has comforted me in my sorrow, has celebrated in my times of joy, and has been the community of believers that has helped me learn and grow. I have said many times that the United Methodist Church has been the most redemptive organization in my life, and I continue to believe that.

As I have been invited to reflect on this question, I want to invite you as well to celebrate the ways the church has been a part of your life. Let us live into God's future for our church together as we live out our church mission statement: "St. Mark's United Methodist Church is a community of followers of Jesus Christ that strives to WELCOME all people, GROW in knowledge and grace and SERVE our neighbors, locally and globally."

Did you know?

- Having a home is important to the quality of life, health, and economic prosperity of families as well as the entire community. In Indiana, the average hourly wage necessary to afford a two bedroom unit is \$14.03; more than half of Hoosier renters cannot afford the fair market rate.
- Greater Indy Habitat for Humanity offers homeownership opportunities to low-income individuals and families who are unable to obtain conventional home financing.
- Research shows that Habitat for Humanity's homeownership program leads to benefits beyond housing, including improved mental health, a decreased reliance on social services, and improved academic achievement of children.
- Last year Greater Indy Habitat was able to exceed their goal and build 27 homes! They
 are aiming high again, in response to an even greater rise in the number of homes
 needed. St. Mark's continues to partner with Habitat on build sites as well as volunteers



A Note from our Lay Leader

At a recent church-wide forum to discuss upcoming changes anticipated in the United Methodist Church, I was asked to provide some of my thoughts as your St. Mark's Lay Leader.

Today, we're here to talk about change. The word change doesn't have a calming effect on me. When my boss calls me and says, "We're going to be making some changes to your position," those words don't necessarily feel like a gift. But change is necessary. And change is a blessing. It gives us the opportunity to grow. Changes are coming in the United Methodist Church, and your presence here shows that you're keenly interested in hearing more. Thank you for that.

But let's start with what it NOT changing.

God is love. We are his children, perfect in our creation, perfected by his grace. He loves all of us. And that means you, and you, and you...and nearly 8 billion other people around the world.

God is love, and that's not changing.

Neither are the principles upon which the Methodist faith was founded and has grown: that we should have a very personal relationship with God that transforms our lives. And that our faith in God should lead us into service for others.

Do no harm. Do good. Stay in love with God. Not changing.

Welcome. Serve. Grow. Our mission at work is something I see right here in the pews in front of me. A community of followers who choose *this* faith, *these* principles and *this* mission to glorify God. We welcome...all. We serve...each other, our community and our world. And we grow...in knowledge, in understanding and in grace.

St. Marks - what we stand for, how we serve, who we are, collectively - is not changing.

Still, the United Methodist Church *is* changing, evolving. And given that its founder would be celebrating his 319th birthday this year, I don't think we should be surprised. Even modern day Methodism - the United Methodist Church as we know it today - is 54 years old. The world has changed a lot in those fifty -plus years. Society has certainly changed. So this evolution in the church is consistent with the natural evolution taking place all around us.

The Church with a capital C is creating a home for all Methodists, all across the world. And it's laying a path forward for inclusive congregations, eager to recognize, embrace and celebrate the sacraments we treasure with all who share our faith.

LGBTQAI+ people love God, too. And He loves them. They are already among us as members of the body of Christ, as members of the United Methodist Church, as members of St. Marks and of our families, and we will continue to welcome all, love all, celebrate all and value all. Change on the horizon means inclusion within our denomination will be authentic and official.

The waiting is painful. But the progress and the process are actively in motion.

The postponement in General Conference will not slow down the changes that are happening.

The log jam is already breaking apart and movement is underway.

A small number of churches - 90 out of more than 30,000 in the United States - have already announced their intention to disaffiliate and join the conservative Global Methodist Church, launching May 1. Brian refers to this as a "splinter, not a split," and he reassures us that Do No Harm will guide the disaffiliation process.

The United Methodist Church will convene for General Conference in 2024, and at that time, we anticipate changes to the Book of Discipline to reflect full inclusion throughout all practices of our faith. The splintering process may streamline those changes. I hope it does.


