I'm also thinking about the many homeless people who are outside on this cold, rainy and snowy evening. It brings up the memory of the 2019 UMW Annual Celebration. At this event, there was a wonderful choir called Matthew's Voices, entirely made up of homeless men and women.

The speaker for that night was Maurice Young, Homeless Advocate. Mr. Young chose to be homeless himself – "I needed to see the world through the eyes of the homeless people." Through his eyes, we heard of the problems of homelessness and how to begin to recognize some of the barriers.

The hands-on mission opportunity that day was to assemble Blessing Bags. We were to keep that bag in our car and give it to someone in need when we encounter a homeless person.

Our ongoing mission projects are many: Oatmeal for Fletcher Place Food Pantry. UMW asks members to donate oatmeal every month to serve those in need. Mustard Seed is an organization that helps the homeless by providing furniture and basic items once they are in homes. Dessert Extravaganza every February is a tasty way to raise money that is used for our mission projects. Soup's On at Fletcher Place is a mission to provide food for the homeless downtown.

# **Prayer Calendar**

Some of us may remember the children's Sunday school song "Jesus Wants me for a Sunbeam." The simple verse reminds us of two basic Christian affirmations: First, that God is light, the source of all truth, goodness and love: and secondly, that followers of Jesus are expected to convey and be the light of God in the world. The identification of God with light is a frequent biblical theme from Genesis 1 – when God commanded "Let there be light"- to Revelation 22-God as illuminator in the new creation. Jesus refers to himself as "the light of the world" in John 8:12, and t disciples as such in Matthew 5:15, the passage in which the life of faith is likened to a candle shining in the darkness. The 2020 Prayer Calendar explores light as a theological and personal reality – the experience of God's light shining on and through us. It uses words and images to bear witness to God's light and to dramatize the various ways in which holy light brightens our individual and corporate dark places. The prayers here help us to shine a light on situations and sorrows in our world that need hope and healing, challenging us to expose abuse and evil that leave many people in shadows of despair and fear.
