



Prayer Calendar

The "social distancing" required by the COVID-19 pandemic of 2020 challenged faith communities and even families to find ways for members to be together while apart. It was an extreme experience of uncertainties and separations that life often holds in relation to loved ones and friends and life itself. Church groups understandably turned to technology to achieve in virtual worship and study of oneness—of unity and kinship—that faith in Jesus Christ promotes.

Prayer is a steady means of experiencing the unity—the togetherness—of the church as the body of Christ in an imperfect, struggling world. It needs no sanctuary and no technology, although it was a central focus of Christian solidarity as the coronavirus health crisis unfolded. World Christian leaders responded to the declaration of the pandemic by urging believers to join in the Lord's Prayer at stipulated times, each praying in their own language. Prayer as a symbol of faith and supplication also unifies families and groups in times of grief, pain and fear.

Prayer represents relationships within the "kin-dom" of God—the family of love and compassion created by the grace of God in Jesus Christ. Prayer is both relationships with God and among people with our great and wonderful diversity.

The 2021 Prayer Calendar highlights the value and necessity of love-centered relationships that withstand all separation and adversity. It celebrates lives devoted to God's mission and to projects that are witness to our togetherness in Christ, even in times of physical distance. It invites us to pray as one people responsive to God's call to relationships of caring, connecting and healing in a world of uncertainty—uncertain in all but the love of God. Prayer is a pathway to this sense of unity.
