

#### Daily Prayer Guide 2022 Experiencing God – Finding Joy

"I've got the joy, joy, joy, joy down in my heart" – the lyric came out of a Methodist summer youth camp in Delaware around 1925 and has been adapted over the last century for use by Sunday schools, revival meetings, pop singers, rock bands, a soft drink commercial and multiple television shows.

What makes "joy" so appealing? The reality and experience of joy, like the song "Joy in My Heart," has religious tone and tempo. The word "joy" is one of the most common in the Bible, both Old and New Testaments. In Hebrew and Greek terms, it names an internal gladness too wonderful to have any source but God. Joy is steady, jubilant thankfulness. With shouts of joy the Israelites welcomed abundant harvest, water for parched land and the restoration of the holy city Jerusalem (Psalm 126/125).

The birth of Jesus is the joy to the world in the Gospel of Luke. Joy is the second fruit of the spirit, preceded only by love, in Paul's Letter to the Galatians, and the missionary apostle tells the Romans, "The kingdom of God is not food and drink but righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit" (Romans 14:17).

For the Christian, the gift of God's grace brings joy, filling the hearts of those who in faith respond to Go's love. It overflows into lives of witness, service and advocacy, healing and hospitality, and the protection of creation.

The 2022 Daily Prayer Guide celebrates the joy-filled lives of missionaries, deaconesses and home missioners, and others professionally engaged in God's mission today. It profiles mission projects and institutions that demonstrate righteousness, peace and joy in their communities. The guide invites and challenges each of us to live lives that reflect and commend joy, even, and especially, in a world of pandemic depression, suffering, discrimination and fear. God baptizes us in joy, and in that gift we find the capacity to exemplify and share joy. Praise God for joy in 2022.
